Successful healing treatment of canine pets using Yoga Prana Vidya healing protocols: A multiple case study

Abstract

Yoga Prana Vidya (YPV) Healing protocols are applied successfully as complementary and also as alternative medicine (CAM) to heal sick pet animals. This paper presents 12 cases of pet canine patients healed successfully using YPV healing protocols. Case study method is used in this study from the documented data available with YPV healers. In respect of 11 out of 12 cases studied, YPV protocols were used as complementary to medication, and full recovery of patients took place from 3 to 38 days depending on individual illness. In respect of the 12th case, YPV protocols were used as alternative medicine as there was no medicine for alopecia with skin rash, and this patient recovered in 10 days of YPV healing. YPV healing protocols have been found to be very effective in treating canine pets as complementary and alternative medicine, as seen in this multiple case study. Further research studies are recommended.

Introduction

Yoga Prana Vidya (YPV) system of energy healing protocols have been established as effective complementary and alternative medicine (CAM) in treatment and cure of many types of diseases, and illness conditions of physical, mental and emotional nature in an integrated manner, healing the human patient holistically ^[1]. Besides human patients, there have been several cases of successful healing of sick canine pet animals also using relevant YPV energy healing protocols, and literature shows one such case published earlier ^[2].

YPV healing protocols apply naturally available bioplasmic energy to humans and also to animals. Animals too have Auras or energy body similar to humans. Commonly owned pets such as dogs and cats have an energy body. A study by Rastogi *et al.* (2015) elaborates alternative herbal medicines for animals that have been practiced since ancient times in India ^[3].

According to Ranquet (2015), natural healing for pets has emerged into the mainstream veterinary medical science, and veterinarians across the USA are now providing acupuncture, chiropractic, energy healing and other alternative methods ^[4]. Energy Healing for animals is a system of protocols to enhance a pet's health, longevity, and quality of life, and deepen their bond with their beloved companion. Animals are so receptive to healing energy, that they're often easier to work with than fellow humans ^[4]. Trained and gifted healers offer a broad spectrum of practices to help animal companions with behaviour issues, pain relief, anxiety, and overall well-being ^[4]. This paper presents 12 successful cases of healing canine pets by two independent YPV healers, as detailed in the following case report.

Case report

Table 1 shows the general profile of the 12 canine pet cases, the nature of the disease suffered and healed using YPV healing protocols.

Out of the 12 cases presented in this study, 11 cases of canine pets and also the first healer were based in Tumkur, Karnataka. The diseases suffered were: Skin related in 5 cases, two cases were Gastroenteritis, one case each of wounds, infected ear, infected eye, and Hematuria. The last and the 12th case was a canine pet based in Bangalore suffering from skin infection, and the second healer was based at YPV Ashram at the time of healing.

YPV intervention

Table 2 shows the details of YPV intervention with time taken in the number of days for complete healing is given. In the next column, an estimated time it would have taken to full recovery if only medication was given without YPV healing is also mentioned for comparison.

Described below are details of the 12th case healed successfully by healer 2 using YPV protocols as alternative medicine.

Case 12 Details of Patient

Named Jack, the pet aged 8yrs was resident in Bengaluru with the owner when he fell sick and healing was done distantly by the healer based at YPV Ashram.

Medical symptoms and causes

The sickness episode for Jack started from 10-06-2022. The pet got some infection at certain area of the body and that caused hair loss, that is diagnosed as Alopecia. Due to infection, he had too much of itching, and redness. Jack is a cross bred dog of Labrador and Pomeranian. When Vet doctor was consulted, he advised there is no remedy and it often occurs in dogs. Moreover, the illness might recur multiple times as he is cross breed. The owner was worried and wanted to help his pet overcome the suffering and discomfort. During the infection his behaviour was very aggressive, and he was consuming very little food. He used to go to his food bowl to eat but after having very little he used to stop. The infection made him very tired because of continuous scratch which made him inactive. He used to have lots of water, as the body was very warm which made him put his tongue out and breathe. Throughout the night he was restless and kept moving from one position of sleeping posture to another, and he preferred lying on the floor.

Medical treatment given to the patient

Medical help

A Veterinary doctor was visited and consulted on 13th June 2022. He did not prescribe any medicines as there was no treatment available for this condition, as it recurs because the dog is a cross breed.

Social life

Jack is known to be a friendly fun-loving dog, but due to the infection he was seen to be somewhat moody. He would

generally interact nicely with other dogs and their owners. Even guests appreciated him as he used to be very friendly with them and obeyed whatever was instructed. Otherwise, during the period of infection, his behaviour was very aggressive and he used to have very little food.

YPV intervention

The dog owner's mother is a qualified and experienced YPV healer, and she took up the case to give treatment with YPV energy healing. Healing sessions commenced from 13-06-2022 through distal healing method.

On feeling his energy levels through hand scanning methods, the healer observed that the infected area was highly congested. The healer further observed that Jack's lungs and spleen, kidneys and liver were found to be congested.

The healer used infection protocol and carried out cleaning and energizing the affected organs (Spleen, Lungs, kidneys, Liver) and even the affected parts were thoroughly cleaned and energized. Healing was done once a day for 15 minutes.

Patient progress and recovery

After first healing on 13-06-2022, itching reduced and the dog was a little relaxed.

After 3 days of healing, it was observed that there was very less itching and redness and there was a reduction in hair fall also. The wound due to itching, started to dry. His food habits improved, and he also slept for a long time.

After 2 more days of healing, itching stopped, redness disappeared and slight hair growth was observed. He stopped scratching (due to less itching) and the spread of infection stopped. Food intake was still low, water intake was high and his coat (the hair that covers his body) was observed to be emitting a foul smell.

After a week, proper hair growth started and he recovered fully from the infection, redness and itching. The skin completely healed. The hair also started to grow back. Food and water intake became normal. His sleep cycle got better. He had energy to go for long walks and play with his toys and balls. The healer stopped healing sessions from 22-06-2022, and the total duration of healing was 10 days. It was a

miraculous recovery result that took all by pleasant surprise. Figure 1 and Figure 2 below show pictures of this dog before and after YPV healing.

In summary, it can be stated that the YPV healing system gave a ray of hope for the dog and the owner. After hearing from the veterinary doctor that there was no cure, they were heartbroken and depressed. But, just within 2 days of healing when Jack started showing improvement, it was a very happy turn for them. They now know that this problem will not be causing any more issues in Jack's life for they have found a cure in YPV Healing.

Discussion & Conclusion

A detailed analysis of the 12 cases of the pet animals healed by YPV healers, shows that YPV system protocols are consistent in successfully healing both as complementary and alternative modes of medicine. There is scanty literature available on similar cases for purposes of comparison of results, though there are many such cases but not adequately documented. A YPV healer had earlier published a paper on successful healing of a pet dog [2].

Bergh *et al.* (2021) did a literature review of CAVM(Complementary Alternative Veterinary medicine) and found 1222 articles, of which only 4 papers of distal healing were reported in animal cases [5]. Therefore, more scientific evidence is required in distal healing of animals. Further research may be conducted by gathering more field data. It will be worthwhile imparting a working knowledge of YPV healing to the frontline veterinary doctors and related professionals to benefit from using these protocols in their respective practices in treating sick animals.
